Host Three Accomplished Artists in April Gallery

Cape Coral FL, March 25, 2009 – The Friends of the Cape Coral Library announce a new exhibit which runs throughout April. The Gallery, located at the Cape Coral Library, 921 SW 39th Terrace, off Mohawk Boulevard, is open daily from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. The new exhibit will feature three accomplished artists.

Skip Weber retired as a Detective Lieutenant from the Bergen County Prosecutor's Office in New Jersey in 1996. Motivated by his late friend, artist Jack Smith of Cape Coral, he has spent the last twelve years mastering control and technique in watercolor, adding light and shadows to his subjects.

Joann Ostrowski is recognized throughout Southwest Florida as a leading water color artist. Known for her attention to detail and strong technical skill, her subjects convey the deep appreciation she has for them by bringing to life their inherent beauty.

For *Inez Buesling*, exposure to art began at a very young age with her parents in northern Germany who incorporated many classic pieces into their home decor. Today, her work is almost exclusively in clay media where she combines geometric shapes, rustic Mayan colors and German patterns into complex pieces that trick the eye into seeing three-dimensional illustrations.
