DECEMBER 1 TO DECEMBER 30, 2015


The library art gallery will hold a Retrospective Show of oil paintings by Cape Coral artist Pat Cleveland. The exhibit will offer a view of the artist's work during earlier years when her vision was normal as well as her more recent work, created while legally blind due to macular degeneration. The changes in her eyesight correspond to her transition from detailed, realistic images to

more impressionistic and abstract paintings with a bolder color palette. This exhibit in the library will include a wide variety of subjects: landscapes, animals, still life, florals, and portraits. Pat graduated from the Traphagen School of Design in New York City and was an interior designer with Bloomingdales in New Jersey and later with Robb and Stucky in Fort Myers, Florida. Pat has been exhibiting her fine art paintings locally in juried solo and group shows since 1981, receiving numerous awards and recognition. Her work has been represented by galleries in Naples, Lakeland, Sanibel, Matlacha, and Fort Myers. Her art is part of many private collections, including those of several celebrities. Pat has enjoyed success in her artistic career and desires to give back to the community. For the past 26 years she has donated a painting annually to the Abuse Counseling Center of Fort Myers auction. This year she also donated two large paintings (one of a panther and another of a Florida black bear) to The Conservancy of Southwest Florida to help raise funds for the protection and preservation of native wildlife.
